DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS:

This position involves responsibility or planning, developing, evaluating and administering a comprehensive mental health day program. An employee in this class identifies needs for services, oversees the development of functional programs and evaluates compliance with program objectives. The incumbent also provides direct service to clients and patients. Work is performed under the general direction of the Commissioner of Community Mental Health Services with wide leeway allowed for the exercise of independent judgement in planning and carrying out the details of the work. Supervision is exercised over the work of all subordinate staff. The incumbent will perform all related duties as required.

TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES:

- Oversees and directs the administration of a comprehensive mental health day program;
- Maintains the effective delivery of quality clinical services;
- Provides direct clinical and treatment services to clients;
- Supervises the intake and screening of new patients, evaluating and diagnosing the patient and problems;
- Oversees the development and implementation of agency policies and regulations;
- Assists the Director in preparing annual budget;
- Provides for in-service training of clinic staff to ensure high quality service;
- Refers cases to other agencies and coordinates activities and treatment programs with other governmental and non-governmental agencies;
- Participates in staff recruitment and selection and arranges for orientation, training and supervision;
- Prepares and maintains a variety of records and reports pertaining to the administration and delivery of mental health services;

- Comprehensive knowledge of the principles, methods, procedures and practices of psychiatric social work;
